Dr. Anderson joined Energy Strategies in 1994. He has over 30 years of experience in energy related research, strategy development and policy. Dr. Anderson manages the 'Energy Supply and Market Studies' Practice Area within Energy Strategies. His work entails developing energy procurement strategies designed to optimize pricing structures and mitigate risk. Dr. Anderson also provides clients with economic assessments of developments in key energy markets and the potential impact of such developments on clients' energy positions. Dr. Anderson supports clients' procurement activities from modeling the procurement options and associated risk to supporting clients through the contract negotiation process.

Dr. Anderson's regulatory work has expanded two decades. He has provided expert testimony before various regulatory agencies on issues including net power cost, revenue requirement, industry mergers and resource planning. States in which Dr. Anderson has provided expert testimony include: Colorado, Idaho, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Texas, Utah and Wyoming.

Prior to joining Energy Strategies, Dr. Anderson was selected by the Governor of Utah to serve as Director of the State of Utah, Division of Energy from 1985 to 1994. While there, he developed energy policy options and implementation procedures for the Governor and the state legislature. In this role his work included technical assessments in the areas of resource development, utility policy, demand-side management programs, and energy/environmental policies.

Dr. Anderson was a member of the State Energy Advisory Board, U.S. Department of Energy, from 1992 to 1995. He also served as chairman of the Western Interstate Energy Board, from 1990 to 1992, the energy arm of the Western Governors Association. In addition, Dr. Anderson has served as Adjunct Professor of Economics at both the University of Utah and Westminster College.
