Since his arrival at Energy Strategies in July 2005, Mr. Farr has been involved in engagements spanning the firm's practice areas. His work focuses on providing research, modeling, and quantitative analysis for the projects he is involved in. He has contributed to contract negotiations, utility valuations, regulatory filings and rate analysis, and facilities planning projects including decision and risk analysis.

Mr. Farr has been directly involved in state-wide public policy efforts to increase energy efficiency and reduce greenhouse gas emissions. He has participated as a member of the Work Group supporting the Governor's Blue Ribbon Advisory Council on Climate Change (BRAC). The group has been working since August 2006 to develop policy recommendations regarding how to reduce greenhouse gas emissions in the State of Utah. As an active member during the process, he served as co-chair of the Residential, Commercial, and Industrial sub-working group responsible for covering policy options associated with those sectors. The final report was released to the Governor in November of 2007.

Mr. Farr's recent work has involved projecting and analyzing the impacts of future carbon legislation on business entities and universities, and developing strategies to mitigate the risks and costs associated with such legislation. Strategies modeled include energy conservation, optimizing fuel-mix and renewable resources, green build policies, and carbon offset projects.

Prior to Energy Strategies, Mr. Farr was in the Utah Governor's Office of Planning and Budget (GOPB) where he served as a Research Analyst/Economist in the Demographic and Economic Analysis division. Mr. Farr worked with a group of economists from GOPB, the State Tax Commission and the Legislative Fiscal Analyst's Office to forecast the state's revenues for use in the state's budgeting process.
